The Russian avant-garde

"Rodchenko and Popova: Defining Constructivism," a large exhibition which just opened at the State Museum of Contemporary Art in Thessaloniki (SMCA) traces the development of this important, avant-garde movement born in Russia around 1913 through the work of two of its most important representatives. The exhibition of around 350 works, the majority of which are from the Costakis collection of the Russian avant-garde, property of SMCA. The exhibition - which was shown earlier in the year at London's Tate Modern, drawing more than 100,000 visitors and eliciting excellent reviews in the press, will travel to Madrid's Reina Sofia Museum in mid-October.

A colorful world

The colorful paintings of the Paris-based Greek artist Yannis Kottis are immediately recognizable for their Mediterranean feel. A selection of his works is currently on display at the Municipal History and Folklore Museum of Aegina. Kottis is much inspired by the Greek landscape and the lucidity of natural light in Greece. His paintings evoke a certain childhood nostalgia and allude to remembrance, with bicycles and animals serving as recurring motifs.
