

ReMap KM, Second Part: Highlights

ReMap is an international platform for contemporary art taking place parallel to the Athens Biennale. As a parallel program to the biennial of Athens, ReMap takes place in the culturally diverse and dynamic Kerameikos and Metaxourgeio districts of downtown Athens. Supporting the already ongoing events, ReMap 2 considers and responds to the unique urban energy, cultural particularities and dynamic artistry of the neighborhood by offering a rich web of cultural events and art happenings that aim to introduce KM as an international hub for contemporary art. This program consists of a rich web of more than 40 cultural events and art happenings, including exhibitions, open-air and site-specific installations by Greek and international galleries, independent curators, art groups, architects and KM residents.



All cultural events take place in empty, functional or derelict spaces, including vacant buildings, parking lots, and plots of land. There are constant Greek participants like the A. Antonopolou Art, the Ileana Tounta gallery, the Kalfayan Galleries, that were also last year on ReMap, supporting the event.
